THE HEARTBEAT OF A MIRACLE

We were sitting on two large stones at the base of a small mountain. The teacher leaned down to the ground, picked up a rock, and handed it to me.

"What do you feel?" he asked.

"Nothing," I replied. "A rock."

"Now put your hand on your neck. Do you feel anything?"

"My heartbeat."

"But the rock had no heartbeat," he said.

"Of course not."

"The rock exists as a rock with no heartbeat. It retains its shape, its size, its consistency, with no need of a heartbeat. But you have a heartbeat. Every moment of your existence hangs on a heartbeat. The moment it stops, your existence is over. That's the difference between a rock and your life. [Yahuah Alahim] God ordained it. Rocks just exist. But life never just exists. It must strive to exist, fight to exist (with air, water, and food). Your heart must keep beating every moment of your life. Even if you do nothing, your heart beats. Even when you sleep, it keeps beating every moment so that you can remain alive. If you waste your moments on earth, still it beats while you waste your time. When you sin, when you gossip, when you covet and hate, still it beats while you do so. When you grieve and weep, when you give up hope, still it beats so that even in your tears and despair, it still fights for you to live and to be able to cry."

"So the difference between my existence and that of a rock is"

"Your life doesn't just exist; it strives to exist. Your life is a miracle. Your every moment is a miracle. Your joys are a miracle. Even your tears are a miracle. Your very life and existence are a gift from Yahuah Alahim. Every moment is sustained by Him. Every moment is a miracle."

"How does one apply this?"

"You cease taking your life for granted. You stop wasting it, mistreating it, treating it as something less than the miracle it is. You cease to allow your life to be given to sin and what is less than [Yahuah's] God's will. You begin to treasure the existence with which you were entrusted. You stop throwing away your moments. You treat your life and your time on earth as a treasure. You treat your every moment as if there was a heart beating behind it, striving for that moment to exist. In short... You live a life worthy of every heartbeat [and worthy of the GREAT SACRIFICE of Yahusha our Messiah, who laid down His life for yours].

The Mission: Life this day in the miracle of your existence. Take account of every heartbeat and make your moments worthy of each one. *Psalms 139:14-17*

The following fits in nicely with *The Heartbeat of a Miracle*.

THE PSALM OF INHERITANCE

"I am your portion and your inheritance among the children of Israel." Numbers 18:20

"Yahuah God is my portion, saith my soul; therefore will I hope in Him." Lamentations 3:24

It is a wonderful thing when we can look upon Yahuah Alahim God as being our portion when we can lay our hand upon all His nature and say there is nothing in Him which will not in some way contribute to my strength and joy. It makes one think of the early days of the settlement of emigrants in the Far West of Canada or Australia. The settler and his family would slowly travel forward, with their implements and seeds, till they reached the plot of ground allocated to them by the Government. At first, the family would encamp on the edge of it, then they would prospect it and go to and fro over its acres with a sense that it all belonged to them, though it needed to be brought under cultivation. In the first year, within the fence hastily constructed, the farmer and his sons would begin to cultivate some small portion of their newly-acquired territory. This would yield the first crops; next year they would press the fences farther out until, at the end of a term of years, the whole would have been brought under cultivation.

So it is with the mighty Nature of Yahuah Alahim God. When first we are converted and led to know Him for ourselves, we can claim to apprehend but a small portion of the length and depth and breadth and height of His Love; but as the years go slowly on, amid the circumstances of trouble and temptation and the loss of earthly things, we are led to make more and more of Him, until the immensity of our inheritance, which can never be fully explored or utilized, breaks upon our understanding. No wonder that the Psalmist breaks forth into thanksgiving in Psalms 16:6-7, and Psalm 91.

The devout soul rejoices in God Yahuah Alahim as his great inheritance. When He is always present to our mind, when we are constantly making use of Him, when we find ourselves naturally turning to Him through the hours of the day, then such quiet peace and rest settle down upon us that we cannot be moved by any anxiety of the present or future. Death itself will make no difference, except that the body which has obscured our vision will be left behind, and the emancipated soul will be able more fully to expatiate in its inheritance, which is incorruptible, undefiled, and unfading (1 Peter 1:4-5).
