APPOINTING YOUR DAYS

"We've spoken of the year before you," said the teacher. "Today we will speak of the days before you. What will the days yet to come bring to your life?"

"How could I know that?" I replied. "I don't really have a say in the matter."

"It is written, 'Teach us to number our days.' What does it mean?"

In the Hebrew it says, 'Teach us to *manah* our days.' The same word, manah, appears in the Book of Jonah where it is written that Yahuah Alahim *manahs* a fish, a worm, and the wind."

"Then *manah* must mean more than number."

"It does. It means to *prepare* and to *appoint*. So you must not only number your days, you must learn to *prepare* your days to *appoint* your days."

"What does that mean?"

"It means that you're not just to watch and wait passively to see what your days will bring. You are to prepare them."

"How can I prepare my days before they happen?"

"How did the first days happen in the beginning? They didn't just happen. Before they existed, Yahuah Alahim our Creator prepared them. He appoint them. He purposed them. So if you're a child of His, you are called to do likewise."

"How?"

"Prayer."

"Praying for days that don't yet exist?"

"Prayer isn't only for what is, but for what is not yet."

"But I can't determine what will happen."

"It doesn't' matter what happens. You appoint your days trusting Yahuah Alahim to bring what is good. You consecrate them for HIS PURPOSES. And then you use your days to accomplish those purposes. **Don't let your days determine your life.**

Let your life determine your days. And don't' just let your days go by. Prepare them, that they might become vessels of blessing and life. Appoint your days."
